

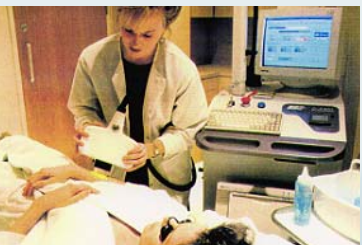

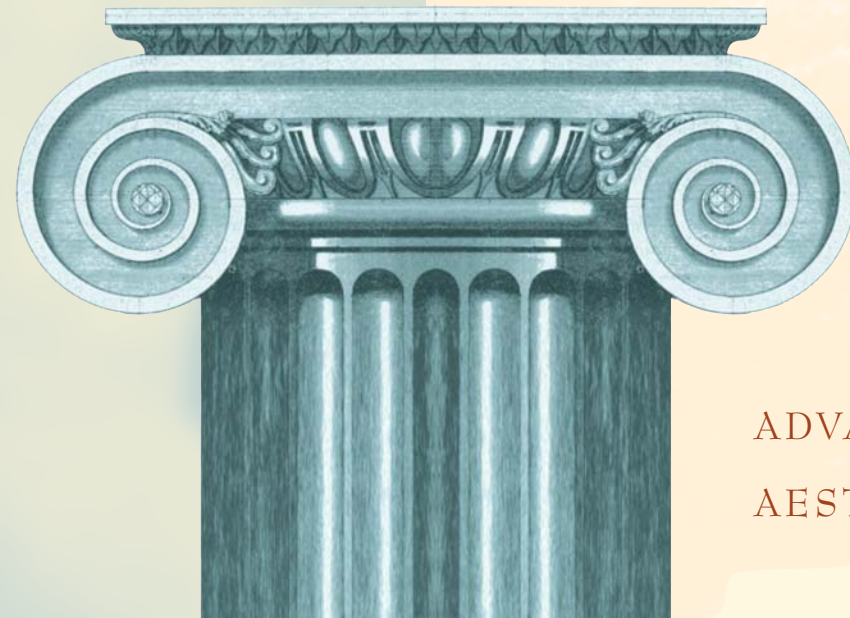

Blepharoplasty

Laser Blepharoplasty (Eyelid Lift)

What is Laser Blepharoplasty?

Laser blepharoplasty refers to eyelid surgery and is designed to remove the excess fat as well as skin, from the upper and lower eyelids. It is the second most common aesthetic procedure performed by cosmetic surgeons. Our procedures involve the use of laser light in a highly focused modality to remove the excess skin along with using the laser to remove sun damage and wrinkled skin in the area around the eyes.

What are the goals of blepharoplasty?

A properly performed blepharoplasty procedure will brighten the face and restore a more youthful appearance. This is especially important, as 80% of our appearance is perceived through the area around our eyes.

How is the procedure performed and what is the advantage of using the laser?

The main advantage of using the laser is the gentle removal of the excess baggy

skin without excessive bleeding. Because there is less bleeding, there is also less bruising which leads to a faster recover with a return to work of in a matter of days.

Are there scars from the blepharoplasty procedure?

In an upper blepharoplasty the laser leaves a fine incision line along the fold where we blink. In lower eyelid surgery, a transconjunctival approach is taken - meaning an incision is made through the inner aspect of our lower eyelid. This approach leaves no apparent scar.

Will the fine wrinkles around my eyes go away after blepharoplasty? And what about my sagging eyebrows and the dark circles under my eyes?

The blepharoplasty itself will not eradicate the wrinkles around the eyes (crows feet) nor will it elevate droopy eyebrows. Instead, laser skin resurfacing can be performed with the carbon dioxide or newest erbium laser, which causes collagen contraction and new collagen formation resulting in a new smoother better textured skin. Dark circles under the eyes will improve somewhat with resurfacing. Any residual discolouration may be treated with our Q Switched or Vascular lasers.

Can anyone have a blepharoplasty?

The best patients are those who are healthy, psychologically stable and well motivated. Some medical conditions such as thyroid disease, high blood pressure

or patients who do not make sufficient tears to keep their eyes well lubricated may increase the risk of blepharoplasty surgery.

What are the risks involved with this procedure?

Fortunately complications are infrequent and minor. All patients will experience some bruising and swelling for a few days after the surgery, although with laser treatment there is less bruising. Some patients may have temporary blurring of their vision, usually due to the ointments applied to the incisions post operatively. In rare instances, the lower eyelid may be pulled down causing an ectropion. If this does not resolve on its own, further surgery may be necessary. The theoretical complications of any surgical procedure, such as bleeding, infection, wound disruption and heavy scarring are also possible but fortunately are quite rare.
